

# Junior Assistant Scoutmaster

**JOB DESCRIPTION:** The Junior Assistant Scoutmaster serves in the capacity of an Assistant Scoutmaster except where legal age and maturity are required. He must be at least 16 years old and not yet 18. He's appointed by the Scoutmaster because of his leadership ability.

## **SPECIFIC DUTIES:**

(specifically defined by the Scoutmaster and Troop Committee)

- Function as an assistant Scoutmaster (except for leadership responsibilities reserved for adults 18 and 21 years of age and older).
- Accomplish any duties assigned by the Scoutmaster.
- Set a good example.
- Wear the scout uniform enthusiastically and correctly when prescribed.
- Live by the Scout Oath and Law.
- Show and help develop Scout spirit.

- Set a good example for all the scouts.
- Attend junior leader training.
- Continue to earn advancement (lead by example).
