If a requirement says that you must take an action using words such as "discuss", "show", "tell", "explain", "demonstrate", "identify", etc, that is what you must do.

f. Second Class 6a and 6b (first aid)

g. First Class 7a and 7b (first aid)

h. Three requirements from one of the required Eagle merit badges, as approved by your Scoutmaster

NOTES:

For Venturers working on Boy Scout requirements, replace "troop" with "crew" and "Scoutmaster" with "Crew Advisor." For Sea Scouts working on Boy Scout requirements, replace "troop" with "ship" and "Scoutmaster" with "Skipper."

- ⁹ Assistant patrol leader is not an approved position of responsibility for the Star, Life, or Eagle rank.
- ¹⁰ If the board of review does not approve the Scout's advancement, the decision may be appealed in accordance with *Guide to Advancement* topic 8.0.4.0

The "6 Month" periods mentioned in requirements 1 and 5 should be counted from the date of the Star Board of Review, to the same date in the sixth month following, regardless of the number of days in each of those months. A 6 month period can thus range from 181 to 184 days.
