Update #1 (6.24.2019):

Troop,

Wow!! It's been a busy couple days, but everyone is good and having FUN. We got the trailer loaded an left the Gatehouse at 10:50 a.m. It wasn't a bad drive into Carlisle, PA. We stopped there for about 45 minutes at a Burger King. We were at camp a little before 2. We returned to camp to get set up and it was off to colors and dinner which was roast beef, mashed potatoes, and green beans. We had chocolate chip cookies for dessert. Off to a great start...or so we thought. The dinner hall is nice, but it's really crowded as the tables and benches are pretty dang close together and if you are on the side or on the back wall, you are basically there for the duration. It definitely makes things like getting up for a salad difficult. It's supposed to be air conditioned too, but....we aren't thinking the unit is working too well. Most returned to camp after dinner and Joseph and I attended a leaders meeting. At 8:15 we assembled for the opening camp fire. The staff put on skits, songs, and cheers with a pretty decent fire. It was over around 9:30 and we returned to camp. Most headed to bed and then talked in their tents. By 11, must everyone was asleep. We are sharing our camp site with a Troop from Allentown, PA and they seem pretty cool. They keep to themselves as the site is somewhat separated so we feel we have our own space, which is nice. The tents are new and there are two large wooden pavilions which is a first as they usually just provide a tarp that's held up by wooden stakes and collects water when it rains. Two large picnic tables are under the pavilion and the camp overall is pretty nice. It's large and we have done a ton of walking. I think I finished close to 20K steps yesterday. After a nice cool night, John and I were up around 5:30 for coffee and the boys got up around 6:30. We had a guick meeting and we headed off for morning colors and breakfast. Breakfast was a bit of a disappointment as they served cereal and breakfast pizza which I've never seen before. It wasn't anything to really write about. The boys headed off to morning program and the adults made their way around camp to ensure they all made it to where they were supposed to go. We returned to our site and rested for a bit, then off to the dining hall for an emergency drill which led right into lunch. That was also bit undesirable as it was ham and cheese sandwiches with lettuce, the salad bar and sweet potato fries. We had siesta until 2 and most the boys hung out in camp and relaxed. I snuck in a quick nap but was up by 2:15 sweating. It does get guite hot in the tents during the day. The boys were off to afternoon program. John and I went to a couple areas and sat in on a computer merit badge class. They are using an air conditioned building where we had our leaders meeting and it's outer walls are lined with padded furniture including a couple recliners which John and I took full advantage of. We didn't stay too long and headed back to camp for a bit before dinner. We assembled at 5:45, retired the colors and had dinner which was Salisbury steak, dinner rolls, perogy, corn, and vanilla cake for dessert. From what I've heard, the boys are enjoying the program and the camp overall. It is big and there's a lot of walking, plus the dining hall is tight. The food has been ok and we are hoping it will get better as the week goes. Stay tuned!! My biggest negative is the water. It's plain nasty tasting. It's ok going down, but once you stop, it taste like someone poured oil in your mouth. They stated it's treated and no one has gotten sick, but boy does it leave a nasty after taste. The other adults are teasing me about drinking it as I tend to wait for some of the colored, somewhat flavored water. It's hard to stay hydrated when the water is motor oil in a cup. I think I'm the only one really complaining about this as I've never had water with a taste guite like it. We aren't doing too much tonight, but tomorrow night is the water carnival and cardboard canoe

race. That will be interesting and I think our boys have a great shot at taking home the gold. I'll be

painting 6 names on the trailer tomorrow if the weather holds out. Outside if it getting a bit warm this afternoon, the weather has been very nice. We did have a few sprinkles this afternoon, but nothing that lasted. Joseph is doing well as SPL and our new boys are having a blast. Don is with them most of the day and reported that they are enjoying it. I've seen plenty of smiles to support that as well. There is always something I miss and will remember later, but that is how it goes. Guess you need to be here to soak it all in.

Update #2 (6.26.2019):

Troop,

Everything is going great!! After I sent the last email, I returned to camp and found some boys and adults relaxing a bit and others off to the trading post getting some goodies. Fred and I played Dominos until dark. We all turned in around 10. One thing I forgot to mention was on Monday, us adults were sitting around camp after siesta and a fawn came busting through camp. I caught something out of the corner of my eye, turned to my left a saw a fawn running right at me. It turned about 10 feet from me and ran around my chair and into the woods. Certainly don't see that everyday!! Fred, Don, and Joseph were up early Tuesday to attend the first polar bear swim at the heated pool. John and I had coffee and got the rest of the boys up around 7. Tuesday breakfast was pancakes and bacon. Boys went off to program. Don remains committed to our first year boys, plus he's working on his Scoutmaster essential training and this week counts towards some of that. Fred is running around at times checking in on boys and doing his thing. John is...well John. I had some down time yesterday and actually set up my hammock and got to spend some time in it reading a book. Felt weird!! The boys are off to a great start and have said how well the programs are run here. I would have to agree. This camp is very organized and I didn't have to go to the camp director and complain about a program area, which is usually a Tuesday oredal. I think that's a first for me, so that's great to see. Lunch was taco salad. After a break, the boys headed off to program again and were back to prepare for colors and dinner which was chicken nuggets and wild rice. We returned to camp to put the finishing touches on the card board canoe and off to the pool we went. Some of the "canoes" were pretty interesting and some Troops put way too much time and money into them. There were 4 heats and we were in the last heat. Ben and Austin were our boys in the canoe. They made it out to the first turning point and capsized. They swam pushing the canoe to the finish and came in 2nd in that heat. While we didn't win, the boys had a blast. After was water polo soccer, followed by the Scoutmaster splash. Unfortunately due to me nursing a right shoulder rotator cuff injury, I didn't take the swim test or enter this year. The boys pressured Don into taking one for the team and he agreed. Each Scoutmaster got to stand on the side of the pool (no diving board like last year) and do their best belly flop out of two. I think there were 12 or 13 adults that went and after Don's epic 2nd splash, he made the final 3 and had to perform another one. We will find out the results at the campfire Friday evening. Way to take one (3) for the Troop Don!! This ended around 9:30 and we headed back to camp where everyone went right to their tents and crashed. We are hopeful to prepare the fire ring for our program tonight or tomorrow night by Butchy and Austin. We will also coordinate our pizza party for Friday night as well in addition to many other things in the works. Wednesday is usually down day, but there's stuff to be done. Program is getting ready to start, so until tomorrow or Friday.

Update #3 (6.27.2019):

Troop,

Well...only 2 days left. This week has gone by pretty quick. The weather has held up nice for us. It has only rained once, Tuesday around 2 a.m. for about an hour. Some leaky tents and some drips, but nothing too serious like the bad thunderstorm last year. It was quite warm yesterday afternoon, even sitting in the shade, you were sweating. It's supposed to be the hottest today and tomorrow though so we'll see how many shirts we can sweat through. The adults will be checking in with the counselors today and tomorrow, so lot's of walking around in the heat for us. The boys are doing great and are putting the finishing touches on their merit badges. They are all progressing nicely. Unfortunately Brent had to leave us last night as he is headed to Germany today, so we are down to 10 scouts.

Yesterday's lunch was American subs and chips. Dinner was baked ziti and salad with brownies for dessert. We had an OA ice social at 8 for those in the OA and then returned to camp for an excellent fire retirement ceremony by Austin and Butchy. We retired several flags in a very respectful manner. We had quite a fire by Zach and by 9:45 us adults were yawning and turned in by 10. The boys stayed up for a bit, but I think turned in a bit later as the week is catching up to them. Don has to leave around 4 and head home until tomorrow afternoon. Owen has an overnight with the Dan Beard program tonight where he'll pack a few items and head out to a designated area and camp with the other Dan Beard guys. That should be pretty neat for him. John continues to instill his knowledge of us and it's good having him around for that.

We should be home (back at he Gatehouse) by 11 - 11:30. Please be available to come get your son. We will text or call you when we are about an hour out. I will send the final summer camp wrap up with Sunday's weekly E-letter.
